Course Expectations

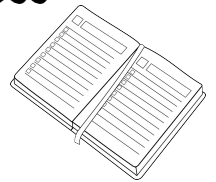

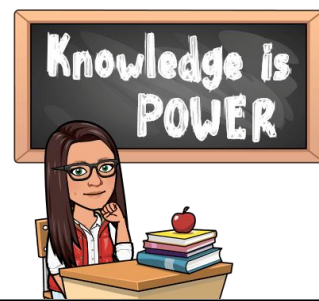


Course Description
